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From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear Parishioners,

I take this opportunity to wish each and every one of you a very happy feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Whenever we celebrate the feast of Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus Christ and our mother, it gives us a sense of joy as we recall that because she said 'Yes' to God's plan of salvation, Jesus was born as a human person and brought us salvation.

This time, we have chosen '**Blessed are you....**' as the theme for our parish bulletin. It fits in very well with the Virgin Mary. When she visited her cousin Elizabeth, she was greeted by Elizabeth with these words "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1: 42b). Mother Mary is blessed because she was a woman of faith, courage, humility, praise and prayer. The message from the Angel Gabriel that she is chosen to be the mother of Jesus, and that she will conceive through the Holy Spirit was a total shock and surprise for her. Yet, she accepted God's invitation in faith, courage and humility. These qualities of Mother Mary were seen all through her life with Jesus and His disciples. We can enumerate some of the virtues of Virgin Mary that truly make her blessed: She was chaste and remained a virgin in order to cooperate with the redemptive plan of God. She was prudent and kept most of the things in her heart: She fled to Egypt with Joseph for the safety of her son. She was always humble: Mother Mary said to the Angel Gabriel "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be done with me according to your word". (Lk 1:38). She was very obedient: Out of her obedience, she accepted God's plan of conceiving Jesus in her womb and remained with Jesus in obedience to the plan of God. Mother Mary lived in poverty: Her spouse Joseph could not get an inn and so, Mary gave birth to Jesus in a manger and wrapped Him in cheap swaddling clothes. (Lk 2: 7). She was patient, especially when she could not understand why Jesus was behaving and doing things which a normal child would not do: For instance, Jesus stayed back in the temple, and she with Joseph searched for Him everywhere and found Him in the temple after 3 days. She endured sorrow and was compassionate: She was very much grieved by the way the officials treated Jesus, condemned Him to death and crucified Him.

When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved, standing beside her, He said to His mother, "Woman here is your son." Then He said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home. (John 19: 26-27). What is the significance of this wonderful and blessed person to us today? What is our relationship with her?

Can each one of us say that Mother Mary is our mother and that she will lead us to Jesus? While the things of this world are required for us for our earthly living, and to that extent we need to work for it and have them, we need to always connect to Mother Mary, who will guide and intercede for us so that we always remain part of the Kingdom of God here on earth and after our death.

The theme 'Blessed are you....' is also relevant to 'Consecrated Life'. Most of the qualities and virtues of Virgin Mary, mentioned above, are applicable to people who live a consecrated life. In fact, Mother Mary is the role model to them. While we pray that these consecrated persons, especially those in our parish, live a life worthy of their calling, let us also thank God for this gift from Him to our lives, and acknowledge their dedicated life and service in the present day situations. Blessed Mother Teresa once said "God has not called me to be successful; He has called me to be faithful". It is the story of the consecrated people. They may not be successful all the time, but they are faithful most of the time.

Pope Francis who spoke emphatically about the importance of religious life during his Sunday Angelus message on February 2, 2014 said "Every consecrated person is a gift for the People of God on a journey. There is much need of their presence, that strengthens and renews the commitment to spread the gospel, to Christian education, to charity for the most needy, to contemplative prayer; the commitment to a human and spiritual formation of young people, of families; the commitment to justice and peace in the human family" (source: Catholic News Agency)

Pope Francis concludes his apostolic letter to all consecrated people on the occasion of the year of consecrated life (published from the Vatican on 21st November, 2014, Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary) in these words: "I entrust this year of Consecrated Life to Mary, the Virgin of listening and contemplation, the first disciple of her beloved Son. Let us look at her, the highly-beloved daughter of the Father, endowed with every gift of grace, as the unsurpassed model for all those who follow Christ in love of God and service to their neighbour."

Once again, dear parishioners, I wish each one of you a very happy feast. May Mother Mary bless us all and guide us to Jesus!

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Blessed Are You Amongst Holy Men And Women



Advent of the month of August and September, we Catholics, all over the world are filled with heavenly joy, as we commemorate the feasts of the Assumption and the Nativity of Mary, our Mother. These feasts of Mother Mary complement each other. Mother Mary was free from sin from the very beginning of her life in her mother's womb. Throughout her life she never had any part with sin. Mary our Mother is our model of *faith, hope* and *humility*. When she became the Mother of our Creator, she truly became the Queen of every creature and that's why all generations call her "BLESSED".

The coronation of Virgin Mary, as the Queen of Heaven and Earth empowered her with fullness of the Holy Spirit and Divine presence of Godliness within her. In the presence of thousands of angels and as Spouse of the Holy Trinity, she participated wholeheartedly in the manifestation of God's reign on earth. Her constant visits on earth through various apparitions and visions enlightened and enlivened the human spirit to God. From the beginning of history of the Church and her Mission, Mary Our Mother intervened and interceded for the conversion of the human heart and soul to God. She appeared and called simple, ordinary, sinful men and women to a life of holiness and godliness. And all those who responded, acknowledged and accepted Her Divine call and surrendered themselves, received the fullness of Heavenly grace and God's ultimate presence in their lives. Here, the ordinary men and women were raised up to the throne of Heavenly Kingdom through the intercession of Mary through her beloved Son Jesus Christ, to God the Father.

Being the year of the Consecrated life, Pope Francis has given a loud clarion to the whole world to pray for all the priests, religious and seminarians that THEY MAY REJOICE IN THEIR VOCATION AND AWAKEN THE WORLD. In the history of the Church, especially in today's day and time when Christians are persecuted, we have seen and experienced the saving hand of God through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Jesus. In order to carry on the mission of God and the Church, Mary has called on simple ordinary sinful men and women to a life of faith, trust and holiness and to sanctify the people and the Church at large. Let us reflect on the lives of the wellknown saints who had a special devotion to our Lady and how she has played a pivotal role in the purification and sanctification of their lives.

St. Francis of Assisi

During his youth, he had been a restless, frivolous, ambitious boy and soldier who hardly gave God a moment of his attention. Jesus once appeared in his dream and said to him, *"Repair my Church."* Later, he had the lovely little old chapel repaired and dedicated it to our Lady of Angels. One day in his prayer, Francis turned with loving confidence to Mary and cried out, *"And I beg thee blessed Mother, the advocate of human race to intercede for us."* Having experienced the constant presence of the Heavenly Mother around him, he began the special devotion to the Lady of Angels. Once, St. Francis had a vision of Mary with Child Jesus in her arms come down from Heaven in a bright ray of light and stand above the entrance of the Chapel of our Lady of Angels. Today, people from all over Europe go on a pilgrimage to this Chapel of Our Lady Of Angels.

The Seven Servite Saints

Belonging to the city of the Republic of Florence these seven rich distinguished young ambitious men had varied careers i.e. as businessmen, scholars, bankers, politicians, widowers and two amongst them were married men. As Catholics, they joined the confraternity of the Loudasi (Praisers) of our Lady, praying and singing hymns in honor of Blessed Virgin Mary. Once, after the Holy Mass they had a mystical experience of the beautiful Queen of Heaven appearing to them surrounded by Angels. Mary said to each one of them, "Leave the world and retire together into solitude in order to fight yourselves, live wholly for God, you will then experience heavenly consolation, my protection and assistance will never fail." As they began their mission, they were known by the people as "Look, there go the servants of Mary." The seven Servite Fathers received another beautiful visit from the Blessed Virgin Mary. She was surrounded by angels who bore the habits of the Servite Order as well as a book, a scroll and palms. She promised them : "you will gain these palms in Heaven if you serve me faithfully on earth."

St. Ignatius of Loyola

A young Spanish nobleman, fascinated with the vanities of the world led by the strong and empty desire of making a great name for himself, grievously injured in war, came to a realization about himself, his soul and his God. Once, during the glorious feast of our Lady of Assumption, there occurred that decisive intervention of Mary which permanently changed the worldly young Spanish soldier into a great, fervent and pure saint of God. One night while praying, he distinctly saw the "Blessed Mother of God with the Holy Infant Jesus." That was the changing point of his life. Once while reciting the little hours in honor of the Blessed Virgin, on the steps of the monastery, his vision carried him beyond the earth. He seemed to see the Holy Trinity and from then on he prayed with great devotion. During his extraordinary novitiate, Mary's soldier, no doubt through her intercession, received numerous heavenly favors.

St. Theresa of Avila

St. Theresa of Avila was a great Spanish Carmelite, a mystic, a reformer and an apostolic soul who is widely appreciated for her work, the kind the world has never known. At 13, she lost her mother. She always approached the image of our Lady for care, acceptance and guidance. Having suffered intensely, she took St. Joseph as her special patron and he miraculously healed her. The saint's writing reveals that the Blessed Virgin helped her many a times and bestowed upon her mystical favors. As Divine proof that the Blessed Virgin was indeed the Heavenly Prioress of the convent, one evening during the singing of the Salve by the choir, she saw the Mother of God, at the beginning of the Salve descending with a multitude of angels, to the stall of the Prioress where the image of Our Lady was and sat herself down. She remained there during the entire Salve and said to me, "You have done well to place me here. I will be present whenever the sisters sing the praises of my Son and I will offer them to Him."

St. John of the Cross

To bring about reform among the Spanish Carmelite friars, the glorious Virgin of Mount Carmel selected a valiant little mystical poet, named John of the Cross. He had experienced the miraculous hand of Mary saving him from the danger of death more than five times. Right from childhood, he practiced penance with a profound devotion, and lived a life of austerity with much thoughtfulness towards the poor. It is said that once, he had fallen into a deep muddy pool and was drowning and he saw a beautiful, resplendent Lady above him, who said, "Give me your hand child and I will draw you out." From then on, he became exceedingly devoted to Our Lady. Another time, the merciful Mother of God appeared to him in all her beauty and splendor and said to him "Have patience my son, for your trials will soon come to an end. You shall leave this prison, will say Mass and be consoled." This gave John of the Cross immense consolation and comfort as his own friars in the community misunderstood and began to harass and persecute him. During his struggles, he would always place his trust and confidence in Mary our Mother as he would constantly sing hymns in her honor and would recite her office, on his knees.

In conclusion, as we celebrate the feasts of The Assumption, The Birth of Our Lady and the Year of Consecrated Life, let us all emulate the saints in their devotion to Mary so that we too may grow with God's grace and mercy, and have fullness of His presence in our homes and religious communities, venerating our Lady the Mother of God and our Mother with special devotion inviting her constantly to be present in every struggle of our lives.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us now and at the hour of our death.

AND A SWORD WILL PIERCE YOUR Own Soul Too!

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons." (Luke 2:22-24).

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took Him in his arms and praised God. And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about Him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to His mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul too." (Luke 2: 25-28, 33-35).

St. Faustina suffered physically and spiritually because of the mission entrusted to her by our Lord Jesus. She writes about it in her Diary and how she was consoled by our Mother Mary.

"During Vespers today, an unusual pain pierced my soul. I see that, in every respect, this work is beyond my strength. I am a little child before the immensity of the task, and it is only at the Lord's clear command that I am setting about to carry it out. On the other hand, even these great graces are a burden for me, and I am barely able to carry them, I see my superiors' disbelief and doubts of all kinds and, for this reason, their apprehensive behavior towards me. My Jesus, I see that even such great graces can be a source of suffering. And yet, it is so; not only may they be a cause of suffering, but they must be such, as a sign of God's action."

"As I continued Vespers, meditating on this mixture of suffering and grace, I heard the voice of Our Lady: Know, my daughter, that although I was raised to the dignity of Mother of God, seven swords of pain pierced My Heart. Don't do anything to defend yourself; bear everything with humility, God Himself will defend you." (Diary No.786).

On Christmas Eve (1937), St. Faustina had another visitation from Our Lady, and she writes, "After Holy Communion, the Mother of God gave me to experience the anxious concern she had in her heart because of the Son of God. But this anxiety was permeated with such fragrance of abandonment to the will of God that I should call it rather a delight than an anxiety. I understood how my soul ought to accept the will of God in all things. It is a pity I cannot write this the way I experienced it. My soul was plunged in deep recollection all day long. Nothing could tear me away from this recollection, neither duties, nor the business I had with lay people." (Diary No. 1437).

On August 5th 1935, St. Faustina was preparing herself for the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy and she writes : "I prepared for this feast with greater zeal than in previous years. On the morning of the feast itself, I experienced an inner struggle at the thought that I must leave this Congregation which enjoys such special protection from Mary. This struggle lasted through the meditation and through the first Mass as well. During the second Mass, I turned to our Holy Mother, telling her that it was difficult for me to separate myself from this Congregation "which is under your special protection, O Mary." Then I saw the Blessed Virgin, unspeakably beautiful. She came down from the altar to my kneeler, held me close to herself and said to me, "I am Mother to you all, thanks to the unfathomable mercy of God. Most pleasing to me is that soul which faithfully carries out the will of God". She gave me to understand that I had faithfully fulfilled the will of God and had thus found favor in His eyes. Be courageous. Do no fear apparent obstacles, but fix your gaze upon the Passion of my Son, and in this way you will be victorious. (Diary no.449).

We too experience difficulties and hardships in our lives which sometimes seem too heavy to bear and also comprehend. At such times, we question the purpose of our lives and wonder, where is God, in all our sufferings? It is difficult to understand and experience the love of God and His comfort. But the Holy Bible assures us that God is LOVE and will never abandon us nor forsake us. We need only call out to Him in faith.

Jesus has given us His Mother Mary to be our Mother, and we can turn to her with confidence and know that she will comfort us and guide us in all our trials and temptations. She understands as she too underwent and experienced sorrow and abandonment in her life, especially at the foot of the Cross of our Savior.

Mary is the Mother of Mercy, so we turn to her with faith and confidence.

To give worthy praise to the Lord's mercy, We unite ourselves with Your Immaculate Mother, For then our hymn will be more pleasing to You, Because She is chosen from among men and angels.

Through Her, as through a pure crystal, Your mercy was passed on to us. Through Her, man became pleasing to God; Through Her, streams of grace flowed down upon us.

CCO ON THE MOVE

The feast of the Nativity of our Lady is a very important feast for all Christians around the world. Mary was chosen by God to bring into this world His most beloved son, Jesus for the salvation of the whole world. It is also a very important day for the CCO of our parish as it completes 11 years! On our 11th anniversary, we thank God for His immense grace and blessings extended to the entire parish through our Centre.

Since the CCO is like an umbrella to all the Associations and Cells operating in our parish, we are pleased to give below a brief synopsis of the happenings in our parish, since the inception of the new academic calendar, which commenced in June 2015.

The **PAC** meeting was held on 18th June 2015. The attendance was par excellence despite the inclement weather.

Laity Sunday was celebrated on 28th June at the 8.45 a.m. Mass. Fr. Lawrence Correa SVD, blessed the lay heads of various Cells and Associations. In the evening, a program was held at St. Andrew's Auditorium, Bandra, to facilitate the members and to increase the knowledge on collaboration with the lay heads and religious. His lordship, Bishop Dominic Savio Fernandes, was the Chief Guest. It was a very informative and interesting program.

The Bombay Catholic Sabha (BCS): Mr. Osmond Pereira, who heads the BCS unit of our parish, informed us that they have received a letter of appreciation from the BCS Office, stating that our parish had collected the highest amount of donations for the Nepal Relief Fund. A great and commendable achievement indeed!

The St. Vincent de Paul Association (SVP) of our parish helps our needy parishioners as well as people of other faiths, with rations, medical assistance etc., and visit the homes of these needy people to get to know them and their living conditions better.

The Federation of Centres for Community Organization

(FCCO) held its meeting at the Salvation Church, Dadar. The theme of the program was Environment and also discussed at length was "what are we as a minority community doing about it", especially considering the rampant changes taking place in the government. Ida Quinny and Antonette D'sa represented our parish CCO, at this program.

Laity Training Programme was conducted on 4th August by the Office for Lay Collaboration Ministry (OLCM) in the Mini Hall by Mrs. Marina D'Souza. The topic was "What is happening in our common home" pertaining to the environmental hazards, their effect on our lives and how we could find solutions to the existing problems.

The CCO as usual, continues to help the poor and marginalised from our parish by filling up forms for medical, housing and educational needs, and gives them to the Benevolent Fund. The CCO has helped 8 girl students to fill up the *Maulana Azad Scholarship* forms and it is gratifying to note that 7 students succeeded in receiving the benefits of the scholarship. For the *Post Matric Scholarship*, 17 children had registered for it. Out of which 8 children were chosen to receive the scholarship.

People of other faiths also approach the CCO for job openings of housemaids, patient care and office jobs. We try our best to place them at places with timings convenient to them.

The CCO team is pleased to welcome on board, Mrs. Antonette D'Sa and takes this opportunity to wish her a long innings with the team.

The CCO is always open and available to parishioners and it is our constant endeavor to support, encourage, improve and find ways to look into areas that need our attention.

Our new focus is '*detection and early intervention*' for little children so that their disability can be remedied at an early age. Similarly, disabled youth are trained and are offered job placements. There is a 'Preparatory School' to prepare the disabled children for formal education so that they are included in the mainstream of our society. Also 'Respite Care' is offered for post-operative disabled, so that they can get the care and support they need for mobility and independence.

In the field of **education**, our sisters are involved in a new education initiative animated by ABBACUS who impart knowledge in new and innovative ways.

In addition, some of our sisters are involved in different capacities in the functioning of **'Creative Handicrafts'** which is a **Women's Co-operative**, started by one of the Missionaries of Christ Jesus – Sr. Isabel Martin. Through this organization, several women who struggle to make ends meet and who have to tussle with problems in the family, find support and encouragement. People around this area call the organization – 'Gudiya Company', as the sisters train the women to produce soft toys which are sold in the open market and the profits then shared.

Belonging to the Lord: this is the mission of the men and women who have chosen to follow Christ - chaste, poor and obedient - so that the world may believe and be saved. NIRMAL ASHRAM Canossian Daughters of Charity

Canossian Daughters of Charity (FDCC), Servants of the Poor (aka Canossian Sisters), was founded by St. Magdalene of Canossa in Verona, Italy, in 1828. They strive *"To Make Jesus Known and Loved"* addressing the needs of the poor and abandoned through sharing bread, understanding, education, evangelization, pastoral care of the sick, formation of the laity and spiritual exercises. Today, they count eighteen provinces with approximately 2,700 Sisters in more than 336 communities and in 35 countries around the world. *(FDCC or F.D.C.C is the Italian abbreviation of "Figlie Della Carità Canossiane"*). Total no. of sisters in India - 610 and at Andheri: 42 sisters, 8 novices and 2 candidates.

'Nirmalashram' Canossian House of formation at Andheri was started in 1963. Our main presence is visible in the form of **Canossa School** which was established in 1969. Until 1976, it was a co-educational institution and from then onwards it became an only girls' school. In the same year, the Salesians of Don Bosco opened Dominic Savio Boys School. In 1974, the **Provincialate** was shifted from Canossa Mahim to Nirmalashram Andheri. Since then, various programs and retreats for Animators and Sisters of the Province are organized here. So too, **Canossa Niketan**, which is presently the Novitiate House.

Socio-Pastoral – Several Sisters have distinguished themselves in the social-pastoral field. One of the most outstanding is the formation of the **Alcoholic Anonymous** Group. Today the A.A. Group has become a parent body with an offshoot at the Holy Spirit Hospital complex. Another sister serves as the Assistant Director at **Balprafulta** (a Salesian venture) which caters to rescuing destitute children and placing them in safe shelters. **Snehasadan's House No. 13** (adjoining our Church) is also looked after by 2 of our sisters.

In June 1979, a small community of 3 Sisters was set up in **Munshi Colony**, to assist Fr. Frederick Sopena S.J. **(Today Munshi Colony Community functions as an independent one.)** The parish is served by many Canossians teaching Sunday School as catechists, serving the youth group in liturgical communities and in various capacities when requested by the Parish Priest. Several sisters of our community serve as animators in the Small Christian Communities (SCCs) of our Parish. Camps are conducted for youth and girls showing an inclination for religious life.

Province Promotional Group has been assisting 230 poor children of our school and also 350 poor families through sponsorship programs, noon meals, coaching classes, providing clothes and stationery irrespective of class, caste and creed. **'Canossa Academy of Skills'** helps ladies to earn their living, through courses such as *Tailoring, Embroidery, Fashion Designing, Beautician, Health Treatments, English Classes and Nursery Teachers' Training* (NTT).

In addition, Coaching Classes for the poor children of the neighborhood specially those studying in non-English medium schools are held from 3.00 pm to 5.00 pm at the **Canossa Jeevan Vikas Kendra,** supervised by sisters and volunteers.



This centre also provides counseling sessions for the needy. The basement hall is used by the *Charismatic Group* of 'Jesus the **Real Vine'**, who conduct their *Prayer and Worship* Service on Wednesday evenings, attracting huge crowds of people from all faiths.

Nirmalashram continues to welcome everyone in need, spreading its golden *rays of love* and *compassion, hope* and *faith, knowledge* and *wisdom*.

WHAT IS HAPPENING TO OUR COMMON HOUSE

A Training Session titled 'What is Happening to Our Common House' was held on 4th August 2015 at 7.45 pm. The participants comprised the Heads and Assistant Heads of various Cells and Associations of our parish, the PPC and SCC Coordinators along with members of the parish clergy team.

Fr. Lawrence Correa SVD, led us into prayer and then introduced Mrs. Marina D'souza from the Office for Lay Collaboration in Ministry (OLCM), the Resource Person for the evening, to the participants.

In this Session, Marina took us briefly through Chapter one of the Second Encyclical of Pope Francis – 'LAUDATO SI' (Praise be to You, My Lord), in which the Holy Father exhorts all people of the world to take "swift and unified global action on environmental degradation and global warming".

Before moving to environmental problems faced by the world at large, Marina firstly drew our attention to 'The Save Aarey Campaign', which involves the Aarey Milk Colony, Goregoan East, the green lung of our neighborhood and one of the last remaining green patches of the city of Mumbai. It covers a total area of 3160 acres of land comprising of gardens, a nursery, lakes, an observation pavilion, picnic facilities, and milk dairy plants. This Area has been earmarked for two new projects: (1) Construction of the Metro Car Shed, by the MMRDA and MMRC and (2) the proposed Goregoan Mulund Link Road.

As a result of these fresh developments, many trees will be axed down/uprooted without an equal number of trees being planted/transplanted, resulting in an extensive destruction of the verdant land with incredible biodiversity. Destruction of Aarey would lead to downstream flooding of the Mithi River and its catchment area; and that's why it is important that we continue with 'The Save Aarey Campaign' with more momentum and commitment!

Other important points that were touched upon :

- Pollution and Climate Change
- The Issue of Water
- Loss of Biodiversity
- Decline in the Quality of Human and Social Life
- Global Inequality
- Weak Public Response

SCIATICA AND HOMOEOPATHY

Sciatica is described as pain along the course of the sciatic nerve which runs from the lower back through the hips, buttocks and into the lower leg. It is caused due to compression of the nerve in the lower back.

It is often characterized by one or a combination of the following symptoms:

- · Severe shooting pain radiating from the lower back to the leg
- Constant pain on only one side of the buttock or leg
- · Pain that is worse when sitting
- Leg pain that is often described as burning or tingling
- Pain accompanied with numbness or a feeling of one's leg "going to sleep"
- Weakness, numbness or difficulty moving the leg or foot
- A sharp pain that may make it difficult to stand up or to walk

The pain may vary from mild to extremely severe and intolerable. It may be intermittent and worsened by activities like bending, lifting weights or could be constant.

Causes of Sciatica:

Sciatica is only a symptom which is primarily caused due to compression of the sciatic nerve by a herniated disc commonly known as a slipped disc, or an overgrowth of bone in the lower spine. Rarely can it be due to tumors or diabetes.

Treatment and Prevention:

Rest.

Avoid standing for long periods of time and activities which increase the pain.

In case of severe sciatica, complete bed rest may be advised. Avoid bending and lifting heavy weights.

Avoid bouncing, twisting and jerking your lower back.

Cold packs and hot fomentation locally will help ease the pain.

Once the acute pain has subsided, back stretching exercises might help in strengthening the muscles of the lower back and preventing nerve compression.

Weight reduction goes a long way in prevention of sciatica, as excess body weight increases the pressure on the nerve roots emerging from the lower spine.

A sedentary lifestyle could make you prone to sciatica.

Regular exercises like walking and swimming improve flexibility.

However it is advisable that you continue to avoid exercises which include lifting heavy weights or bending your back.

For a long lasting and permanent cure, it is best to turn to homoeopathy. Homoeopathic medications help reduce severe pain and prevent recurrent episodes of sciatica. It helps relieve back pain and strengthens lower back muscles thus easing the compression on the nerve roots. Homoeopathy can put the spring back into your step, without any side effects.
